Typical Milestones for 12–26 Months

Typical Milestones for 20–36 Months

Kicks a ball						
Stands on one foot for 3-seconds						
Walks on tiptoes						
Runs with relative ease						
Walks upstairs alone (both feet on each step)						
Jumps with two feet (3 times)

FINE MOTOR:

Typical Milestones for 12–26 Months

Fills and dumps containers of toys						
Paints with whole hand or fingers (circle one)						
Paints holding a large brush						
Tears paper						
Scribbles with large crayon						
Stacks one large block on another						
Turns pages in a book						

Typical Milestones for 20–36 Months

Fill and dumps containers of sand or water						
Finger paints using both hands						
Paints with a large brush using strokes and dots						
Uses a large crayon in a circular motion						
Tears paper						
Cuts with scissors						
Strings 5 large beads						
Puts together a 5 piece puzzle						
Builds a 6 block tower						
Turns single pages in a book						
Can squeeze and use a clothespin

Typical Milestones for 12–26 Months

Shows interest and curiosity in their environment						
Imitates actions of adults

Typical Milestones for 20–36 Months

Imitates actions of adults and plays with other children						
Refers to self by name						
Identifies six or more body parts						
Recognizes the colors: red, blue, yellow and green						
Associates the use of common objects (cup-drink, food-eat)						
Draws a face (no arms, no legs)						

LANGUAGE & COMMUNICATION:

Typical Milestones for 12–26 Months

Attempts to verbalize wants and needs						
Attempts to sing along with songs						
Responds when name is called						
Enjoys looking at books						
Points to pictures in book and tries to name						
Makes common animal sounds						
Uses appropriate language and style for context

LANGUAGE & COMMUNICATION:

Typical Milestones for 20–36 Months

Verbalizes wants and needs						
Describes what happened in 2-4 words

Identifies boy or girl						
Identifies animal sounds						
Repeats part of a song or finger play						

MATH DEVELOPMENT:

Typical Milestones for 12–26 Months

Will repeat 1, 2, 3						
Points to big and little objects when asked						
Can match “like” shapes						

Typical Milestones for 20–36 Months

Can count to 5 (with help)						
Understands the concept of one						
Indicates an awareness of more than two						
Points to big and little objects						
Knows the difference between a circle and a square						
Understands positional words (up, down, under, on)						
Can group things together by size						
Can follow 2 simple directions (stand up & put your hands on your head)

Engages in independent (alone) play						
Interacts with adults						
Participates in floor play (blocks, cars, cause & effect toys)						
Participates in role play with an adult						
Listens to short stories						
Show affection and other emotions to others						

Typical Milestones for 20–36 Months

Separates easily from parents						
Engages in independent (alone) play						
Engages in parallel play (beside another child)						
Participates in group activities						
Listens quietly to short stories						
Shows affection and other emotions to others						
Values own personal property & names personal belongings
